RE: PRISON PHONE COST EXPLOITATION

Greetings Mr. Chairman:

I am writing to you today with a most serious issue. For the past 21 years I have been forced to rely on letters, visits, and phone calls to maintain communication with my friends and family. The prison phone system has become expensive on my family and myself. It costs almost \$10.00 for 15 minutes to call my sister in Florida from Pennsylvania. Over \$5.00 for 15 minutes to call Pittsburgh from Albion (132 miles away). There are numerous long distance plans being offered by competitive phone companies that are more affordable for the prisoners and their families which we are not able to utilize.

My wife has paid thousands of dollars on phone calls, a few times being charged twice for calls, hidden charges and fees being attached to her phone bill. Until now there hasn't been anyone we could voice our complaints to. The phone company is taking an unfair advantage of a captive audience, giving us no other option but to use their product, and charging exorbitant rates. When I purchase a phone card from the commissary here at the prison and place a call my wife has also been charged for that same call. One call, two people being charged for it. Some have said, "If you can't afford the phone calls stop making them." To which I have responded, "If prisoners do not communicate with family and their communities they will sever the ties they have to them. When they no longer share a common thread and concern

for their issues they tend to sympathize LESS with them.

And less sympathy translates into a wide array of social issues. Prisoners need to be reconnected to society and their social responsibilities. Communication is the key to any relationship and needs to be better facilitated by the prisons, state, and telecommunications companies.

We appeal to you to step in and even the play field. If not for the incarcerated citizens who have committed offenses against the state and who are striving to regain "Citizen in Good Standing" status, then do it for the tens of thousands of tax paying citizens who truly rehabilitate prisoners with their spiritual, emotional, and financial Those citizens, like my wife, who hold us accountable and encourage us to be productive citizens. The very same people who foot the bill when we are released and few care to give us a chance to be productive, the same who continue to encourage us to stay the course even against adversities. These are the people I plead you protect against exploitative prison phone costs, the ones that are already volunteering as social workers, therapists, guidance counselors, financial aid agencies, and mentors for the State (free of charge).

May The Creator of the heavens and earth bring harmony to this and other related issues that divide incarcerated citizens from their brothers and sisters in the community at large.

Dear Chairman Genachowski:

I have been incarcerated within the Pennsylvania Department of corruption for the last 17 years. And as a result of the Departments continual practice of creating bi-lateral contracts with private companies, my phone cost is approximately # 15.00 for a 15 minute phone call to city that is only two hours away from my current facility.

The law of contracts clearly indicate "that party Not involved in or a signatory of the contract is not bound or obligated to the terms of that contract." I bring this up because staff of SCI. Albion will not allow us immates to use the services of private carriers that our families patronize. For example: My daughter received a 1-814 number from Google.com to minimize the exorbitant cost of using the D.O.E.'s carrier, and after receiving approval from the institution to use this number - the number was blocked once staff realized that this number was a local number and my daughter lives in Ohio.

As a result of this, I cannot call my family at all because of the \$15.00 cost. My mother, who is 75 years old, is forced to block my collect calls because she what this makes her look like she doesn't care, but one phone call is the

deference between her being able to pay her phone bill and Not. This practice of preying on the families of those incarcerated is cruel and illegal.

Correctional facilities are nonprofit agencies of Pa. law, who house a committed commonity of people for a duration of time set by a court of law. This population is a community under the direct care, custody and control of this nonprofit agency. So, any contracts they enter should not prey upon its community or afford it an unduc enrichment. If it does and interferes with the free traffic in that article-you have an MONOPOLY.

"This is a public comment for the **Wright** Petition (CC Docket #96-128)." I would like to make a few key points regarding the petition by addressing it in the following manner:

During the 24-plus years that I have had to endure using the prisoner phone service to speak to, and stay in contact with, my loved ones, the financial burden on both them and myself has been "overwhelming".

The high cost; not commensurate with that of people in the "free-world" who communicate with each other via telephone, has crushed the ability for incarcerated people and their loved ones to stay in continued contact.

Rehabilitation through continued connection with family members and friends, has been touted by corrections professionals around the country as a valuable tool in reducing recidivism. However, many Department of Corrections' (DOC) are entering into contracts with prisoner phone companies who are willing to find "loop-holes" which will help generate additional funds that can be funneled into corrections budgets. (Usually a "tax" of some sort!) These funds are then used to "plug holes" in those budgets. A burden already assumed by the tax-payer! (It appears to be, essentially, a "double-dipping" scheme!)

By using monopolization tactics, these phone companies, in conjunction with DOC officials, aim their sights at prisoners and their families and target them because they (prisoners and their families) only have two (2) choices/options: Pay the exorbitant amount(s), or have no contact!

Many prisons are either too far, have stringent regulations on who and how many people can visit, or have days and times that just don't suit every schedule. Add to that illnesses which prevent travel and the high cost of gas--most prisoners come from poverty-stricken areas where even gas money for loved ones is a "luxury" (traveling just half-an-hour away is practically impossible!)--and the phone becomes not just a valuable commodity, but a lifeline!

I understand, as so many people do, that these high phone rates only affect a small segment of society. But make no mistake, they are an unnecessary burden, (no matter who they affect!)

The families and friends who would otherwise be able to stay in contact, at least a couple/few times a week, instead are limited to perhaps one weekly, one bi-weekly, or one monthly phone call! (Which has a time-limit of about 15 minutes!)

It should also be interesting to note that what should be a .04¢ a minute rate is pumped up to .192¢ for in-state (local) calls, and .263¢ a minute for interstate (out-of-state) calls! An increase of 480% - 658%! (Even higher rates occur in other states!) Again, these are profits that the DOC and phone companies keep!

The impact that these extremely high phone rates have had is immeasurable! Surely they have had an untold impact on the unity of family. And surely they have eroded the rehabilitative process! (Which poses the question: "What will just those two effects have on a prisoner reentering society?")

Please stop these unfair practices! Help end the "taking advantage of" those who cannot fend for themselves! Help give them a voice! Ensure fairer costs and fees for prisoner phone services!

Dear Chairman Genachowski:

The cost of the phone systems in our prisons far exceeds the costs of even the most expensive phone lines available in the free world. One of the purposes of allowing the phones in to the dorms is to increase family contact and support through long sentences. Yet, the rates are so high that families must choose between paying for groceries and medicine or contact with their loved ones. In most cases, those of us in the nation's prisons are left out in the cold.

In my case, I have had to deal with extremely limited contact through family emergencies including: my father's kidney cancer and treatment, my three year-old daughter's surgery, my sister's stroke, and several others. I was limited to what information I could receive in letters, as well as one 15 minute phone-call per week. At a cost of between 504 and \$1 per minute for an in-state call, this is just all that I can reasonably ask from my family.

These monopoly phone companies charge rates that would be considered usurious in any other situation. However, because they are dealing with society's "throw aways", nobody seems to care. And because of costs, even family members must learn to let go of their loved ones and leave them to the system. In short, if they

Choose to care about someone in jail, they are punished financially by a private company that rakes in exorbitant profits each year. These are families that are often alredy working to scrape by on limited incomes, due to the loss of a wage earner. These rates punish the family, not the inmate.

My family is not alone in suffering financial hardships as a result of the excessively high rates charged by the monopoly phone company in my unit of incarceration. They are one family among thousands victimized by a company with no interest aside from profit, and no reason to consider lower rates, since they have no competition.

Please consider taking action to force these companies to bring their rates in line with those charged by phone companies in the world. Ask them to embrace modern technologies to expand the calling base to include the growing number of families with no land lines (who use only a mobile number). Most of all, demand that they stop punishing our families for the crimes that we have committed. I am the one who broke the law, not my four year-old daughter.

The impact of the high cost of prison phone calls made through Securus directly inhibits the amount of time I can special talking to my parents and family. Both parents are in severely poor health and it is uncertain if they will be alive when I am released in 51/2 years. My mother bears—the brunt of the cost as I call her 1-2 or mere times per week for 13-15 minutes. She is on a fixed income (social security) and the cost \$75.00-\$100.00 per month is outrageous as she is forced to do with a other things because of this expense. My family is mostly in Texas.

That the Arrzona Department of Corrections (A.D.O.C.) is engaging in a scheme of kickbacks to the tone of 53.7%, as reported in Prison Legal News (4/11), thus consciously profiting off of my family, is unconsionable and severely limits the positive effects this important family contact provides. I can only call my father once of twice a month because of the cost and the additional financial burden of sending me money on a monthly basis to meet nutritional, hygeine and clothing near It is completely cost prohibitive to call mysister, as her financial situation is burd arred by epilepsy, a heart and tron and dronic back pawn. A one carner family with two children, the extra \$50.00-\$60.00 a month to be able to speak with me is not a burden she can afford. My brother found a cheaper rate for collect calls, however, after Seaves caught on they restricted his phone number. After engaging the inmate phone trouble shooting system they told me that he MUST contact Securus. (See attached exhibit). In effect, ADO.C. and Securus were instructing a fine, law abiding citizen, in it's monopolistic actions, that he MUST set up an account with Securis so they can properly riphim off and profit handsomely off of cad phone call with his brother. To date I cannot call him as his financial situation has worsoned and he cannot afford the exorbitant rates charged, as well as, transaction fees associated

with payment. As a 6.05 fee is charged for payment of funds to the account.

Further, the egregious rates charged for inmates to buy phone time through the other monopolistic scheme, (keefe Commisary Network Sales) is excessive. Especially since my part time job in the library that pays 40¢ par hour is not adequate enough to allow me to buy phone time to call my two sons or any friends. As it is wholly unfair to burden them with the cost of these phenes calls, accounts, fees with Securus. Thus closing a door of communication completely.

Phone calls are an important part of my rehabilitation and preparation to roturn to the community and is being hindered by the malicious conduct of Securiand ADOC. In their scheme of greed, habitual corruption which is tanta mount to racketeering and should be recognized as such by the PCC and Federal Authorities. Mandating a particular company provide services in a free warket system would be a form of Communism. Discrimination, against a create class of crizens (prisoner's families). Is this what the ECC chooses to condone? We already know the state government condones it, as they are profiting from these practices. Are these profits taxed? This is an obviously predatory scheme upon all inmates and their families right to choose their own low cost, long distance, collect call provider. This choice should not be taken away by any company, institution or state. This is extertion!

I would strongly suggest this practice, echeme, kickbacks be closely scrutinized by the FCC to determine what laws of commerce and unfair predatory business practices are being utilized. As it is in the public intrest, the intrest of inmates and their families who are also paying a steep price for their loved one's incarcevation. A price or fine not authorized by law that is in no way reasonable or fair. I thank you in advance for scrupulously investigating the practices of the companies and states involved in this egregious behavior.
